**Welcome to the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis**

The St. Louis Fed is located at One Federal Reserve Bank Plaza, at the corner of Broadway and Locust Street in downtown St. Louis, just minutes from most major highways. The street in front of the Bank's main entrance, formerly Locust Street, has been renamed One Federal Reserve Bank Plaza; however, the new name may not appear on city maps.) Attached is a map, in PDF format, for directions to the Bank.

All employees and visitors must enter the Bank through the main entrance, located on the plaza. This entrance is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The Bank is a nonsmoking building.

Parking is not available onsite, but we will validate your parking if you park at the **St. Louis Centre East Garage** with entrances located at Broadway and St. Charles or on Sixth Street, between Washington and Locust. **Please bring your parking ticket with you for validation.** Please allow 15 minutes for parking and entering through Bank security.

After you park your vehicle, exit the parking garage at street level. You will cross Broadway and walk through the pedestrian plaza to the Bank's main entrance. You must have a driver's license or other government-issued **picture ID** to enter the building. Everyone who enters the building will be required to walk through metal detectors. All purses, keys, cell phones and other hand-held items will be sent through X-ray equipment.
